November is National Adoption Month, a time set aside to celebrate our foster families and raise awareness about the ongoing need for more families to provide a child or youth in care with a forever home. This has been an exciting year for our foster families because of the children who have achieved permanence through adoption. To celebrate the final adoption of kids in care in the District, CFSA in partnership with the DC Superior Court last week hosted the 33rd Annual DC Adoption Day in Court Celebration. William Miles and his partner formalized the adoption of their soon to be six-month-old daughter Farrah Exodus Miles-Proctor, during the 33rd Annual DC Adoption Day Celebration on November 16. CFSA applauds Mr. Miles, a resident of Upper Marlboro, MD., who is currently an adoptive parent of four other children, three of whom are biological siblings of Farrah Exodus. Thanks to Mr. Miles, these siblings will now grow up together in their forever home!

Veris McNeil, the aunt and kinship foster parent of two-year old Madeline Roberson, has been extremely diligent in ensuring that her extensive medical needs are met. Madeline, who was born premature and spent the first year of her life in a hospital's Newborn Intensive Care Unit (NICU), has made tremendous progress and some of her medical devices and around the clock nursing care are no longer required. Now that Madeline's adoption was formalized at this year's Annual DC Adoption Day Celebration, she can now live with her brother since her aunt who lives in the home has guardianship of him.

Dr. Arif Griffin was matched as a forever home for Nasir Todd in April 2019. Nasir, who has been in foster care for nearly three years, celebrated his adoption during the DC Adoption Day celebration. Since being in his adoptive home Nasir has been stable and extremely happy.

Fostering Spotlight

Could You Be A New Home for Za'layja?

Two-year-old Za'layja enjoys listening to music and watching cartoons. She is medically fragile with cognitive and physical developmental delays. While she can roll from her back to her belly, grab objects and is learning how to crawl and stand, she just recently obtained a gait trainer that allows her to stand for 30 minutes for approximately two-to-three times a day. Za'layja is non-verbal and uses a G-tube for feeding, along with a feeding pump and feeding bags.

Za'layja has a physical therapist who works with her resource parent and nurses to support and improve her physical development. She receives these physical therapy services twice monthly from a facility in Prince George's County and has recently begun attending weekly outpatient physical therapy. Because she is not yet of school age, she is cared for by her nurse and resource parents full time.
