FACES.NET Management Reports Overview training is designed to help CFSA and Private Agency social workers become sufficiently familiar with accessing the reports. Students will become knowledgeable on how to effectively navigate the report screens and how to export reports to spreadsheets. They will use analysis tools to track case-plan, visit and other specific reports related to their job function. Who Should Enroll? The course will educate workers about the new and improved FACES application. FACES.NET showcases new looks and new navigational methods that will make your data entry experience more pleasant. The course will begin with a slide-show, covering the basic lay-out of the system, navigational changes, and security matters. Workers will then get hands-on experience in recording placement and service provider information. With FACES.NET, you now have the capability to print out your home studies from the system! As an added bonus, the Provider Directory is now available on both the CFSA <u>Intra</u> net as well as the <u>Inter</u> net. This means that now external agencies can also see the community-based providers that are available for our clients by visiting the Provider Directory on the web. Who Should Enroll?
