
<u>Child Welfare Population is Declining</u>: Number of children in the child welfare system has declined fairly steadily from 7,500 in 2003 to 4,000 today. Number of children served at home is now equal to children in out-of-home care. \grave{e}

<u>Gender Balance:</u> For many years, boys and girls have been about equally represented in out-of-home care.



© <u>**Groundswell of Youth:**</u> Proportion of older youth in care, ages 13-21, peaked at 60% in 2007 and is now slowly declining to 54% today. CFSA is seeing a slight rise in children ages 4-8 while other age groups remain flat.





© Most Children in Family Settings: The majority of children and youth in care are in foster homes where they experience a family environment. CFSA continues to succeed in reducing the number of youth in congregate care and to strive to place more children and youth with their relatives (kinship care).
