HEALTHCARE QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE Medical Consents



Contact the Child and Family Services Agency (CFSA) Clinical and Health Services Administration (CHSA) On-Call Information Line at 202-498-8456, 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. For purposes of this tip sheet, the term "child" includes both infants and youth, as applicable.

Medical Consents Policy

- 1. A parent or legal guardian must provide consent for CFSA to obtain medical records, except for routine evaluations and treatments.
- 2. Minors (persons under the age of 18) may consent to their reproductive health services without agreement from a parent or guardian.

Note: CFSA cannot provide funds for pregnancy termination. The social worker cannot assist with the process.

- 3. When parental rights have been terminated, CFSA is the legal guardian of the child and may provide medical consent for services (e.g., a test or examination) until the child is adopted.
- 4. When CFSA has physical custody of the child within the 72-hour period before an initial Family Court hearing, CFSA may consent to the following procedures without parental consent:
 - a. Medical evaluations
 - b. Emergency medical treatments
 - c. Outpatient psychiatric evaluations
 - d. Emergency outpatient psychiatric treatments

Note: in keeping with best practices, CFSA shall inform the child's parents or legal guardians if any of the above procedures occur.

5. CFSA may <u>not</u> consent during the 72-hour time period to non-emergency outpatient medical, dental, or psychiatric treatments. Nor shall CFSA consent to an autopsy without reasonable efforts to obtain consent from the birth mother, father, or legal guardian.
